

MOY music camp 2015 Singapore

This is the second time that I come to Singapore, but this time, we played music with the Raffles students and also students come from Malaysia.

At first, I was very excited about going to singapore, I am going to play with many talented players from Singapore, there are many talented orchestras in Singapore.we almost spent several hours practicing everyday.

The concert 'the best of joe hisaishi 'was wonderful . The Singapore symphony orchestra played many pieces that night . The most memorable piece is my neighbor TOTORO for orchestra , I think it was the best piece I have ever listened. During the few days practices, I have learnt that I need to pay more attention on the dynamics on the scores in order to make a beautiful piece, we need to jot down more notes on our own scores to remind ourselves that we need to do all things that we wrote during practices and especially during the performance. When I practice in Hong Kong, I usually don't pay a lot attention on the dynamics written on the scores, I seldom think how could I play the piece more better, how can I use my bow wisely to play a more beautiful tone. Dr tan reminded us many time that we should pay attention on our notes and also the dynamics, I will try to remember what Dr Tan and miss Lillian Wang have taught us.

This music camp was very amazing, thank you Dr tan and miss Lillian wang for teaching us and I hope I can come to Singapore again next time!
